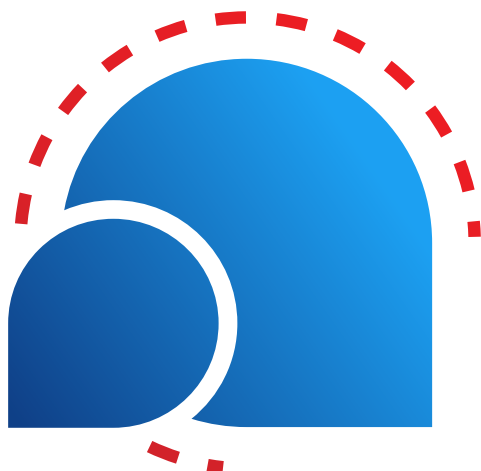

ABSTRACT

The management of skin lesions today represents a clinical and organizational challenge that requires solid expertise, coordination skills, and an integrated vision of treatment pathways. 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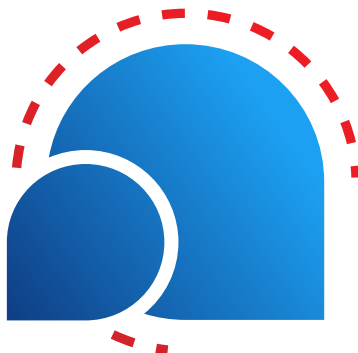
